

Repairing bent or dented frame on a Hearth Pad

Items needed for repair:

Length of frame matching damaged frame piece Corner plugs to reset, 45° or 90°
Drop cloth/cardboard
Heat gun
Putty knife
Hammer
Grout to match
Grout sponge

Bucket

Clamp

Block

Instructions:

- 1. Lay the hearth pad on the carboard or drop cloth tile side down
- 2. With the heat gun slowly heat the frame until the construction adhesive softens
- 3. Using a putty knife place the blade between the frame and the substrate and tap lightly with a hammer; this will help remove the frame from the substrate.
- 4. Clean any loose grout or debris around the newly exposed area, replace the framing and corner plugs using construction adhesive. Assure that all the joints are tight.
- 5. Use a clamp block on top and bottom of the frame and let dry over night
- 6. Flip the pad to the tile side up and remove any loose grout and debris.
- 7. Mix the grout to a creamy "peanut butter" consistency. Spread out over the area being repaired and let sit for 15 minutes before cleaning with a damp sponge.
- 8. Let sit for an hour. Wipe down, dry and remove all remaining dust.
